

# Support to reuse and recycle

## Introduction

Waste accounts for 4% of Scotland's total greenhouse gas emissions; a significant amount of the emissions from waste sites is from methane as the waste decomposes – methane is 86 times more potent than CO<sub>2</sub> over a 20 year period.

Recycling rates in West Dunbartonshire are low – at just 36%, which generates the equivalent of just under 10,000 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> per year (SEPA, 2021).

Transitioning to Circular Economy practices and increasing the efficiency of resource use will significantly support the goal of achieving net zero by 2045.

In a circular economy:

Products and materials are shared, maintained, reused, refurbished, recycled, and composted. Waste is kept to a minimum.

In other words, we find smarter, more efficient ways to do business and produce goods without constantly relying on resources that will eventually run out.

A circular economy helps tackle climate change, biodiversity loss, waste, and pollution.

## Ideas towards a circular economy



### 1. Share, Maintain, and Prolong

Community members borrow and maintain shared items, learning repair and care skills.

*Library of Things*

Borrow household items like carpet cleaners, tents, or sewing machines.

*Tool Library*

Access DIY tools with optional training and workshop space.

*Refill shop*

Reduce plastic waste and promote conscious consumption.

### 2. Reuse and Redistribute

Items are passed on to others when no longer needed.

*Clothes Bank / Swap & Repair Spaces*

Donate, exchange, or repair clothing and electricals instead of sending it to landfill.

*Food Bank / Community Larder*

Distribute surplus food to those who need it. Combine with workshops or cafes.

### 3. Refurbish and Remanufacture

Items are upgraded or rebuilt by experts.

*Repair Café / Upcycling Shops*

Bring broken household items to fix with volunteer experts – keep things working longer!

### 4. Recycle

When items reach end-of-life, materials are recovered and reused.

Support community efforts to separate waste properly for recycling or composting.
